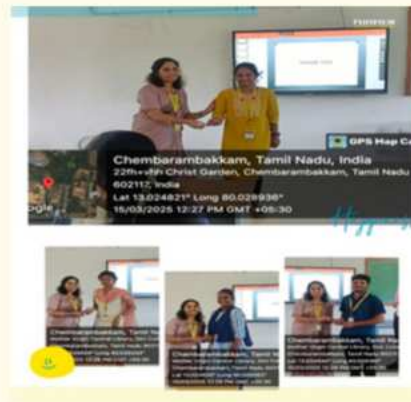

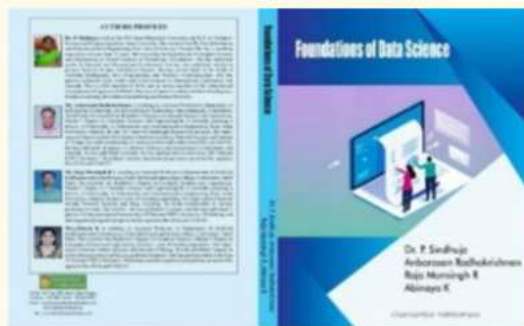

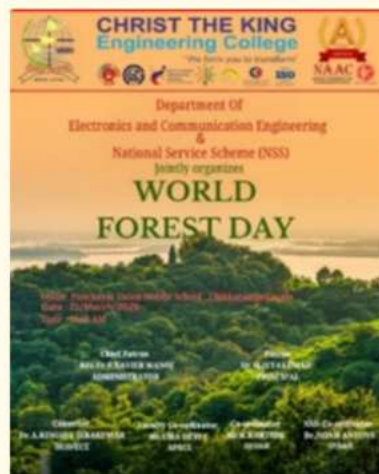

TECHNICAL TRAINING & PLACED STUDENTS MOTIVATION:

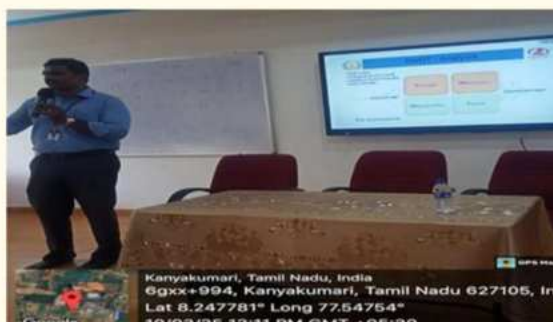
